# Loom Knitting Flexible Scarf

## **Introduction**

**Overview:**

This scarf is made on a large circular single rake loom using a fun fur or eyelash yarn. The key is to use a yarn with a very thin strand that has fringe coming off it. It is the ability of the yarn to slide against itself that allows the scarf to stretch into a long skinny tube, and into a short fat tube. Using other textured yarns for this pattern may not produce the same results.

**Materials Needed:**

- Large gauge round knitting loom, with at least 40 pegs
- Hook tool
- 3 skeins fun fur or eyelash yarn
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

**Knowledge Required:**

- Casting on to a loom
- E-wrap stitch

**Notes:**

**Directions:**

Cast on: Make a slip knot, leaving a 6" tail. Put the slip knot onto the anchor peg. E-wrap the entire loom twice and knit off.

Continue with the e-wrap stitch until the scarf is 60" long, or your desired length. Be aware the scarf does not hold a single shape well, so you may want to judge the length in its stretched form.

When the scarf is the desired length, measure 2 more yards of yarn, and cut the yarn. Do not cut the yarn at the end of the knitting.

Thread the end on a tapestry needle, and put the needle through each loop on the loom. When you get all the way around the loom, remove the tube from the pegs.

Stretch the opening as far as it will go. Tie the end tail.

Weave in the yarn ends.
