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Loom Knitting Neck Warmer

Introduction

Overview:

This neckwarmer is made on a large gauge single rake looms and is folded over before binding off to make it double thick. The adult size is made on the round green Knifty Knitter loom; the child size is made on the red Knifty Knitter loom. The twisted stockinette (e-wrap) stitch is used throughout. The sample was made with one skein Patons Nuance (1.75 oz/50g, 89 yds/82m) in color Nightlife #71130.

Skill Level: Easy

Materials Needed:

- Large gauge round knitting loom with 36 pegs for adult size (green KK)
- Large gauge round knitting loom with 31 pegs for child size (red KK)
- Hook tool
- 1 skein bulky (5) yarn. Can use worsted weight (4) yarn with two strands held together as one.
- 2-3/4" metal tapestry needle
- Scissors
- Row counter

Knowledge Required:

- E-wrap cast on
- Twisted stockinette (e-wrap) stitch
- Knitting tubes on round looms
- Flat bind-off (directions given)

Gauge:

4" = 12 rows, and 7 stitches; exact gauge isn't critical

Size: Child, Adult

Notes:

- Instructions are given for sizes Child (Adult).
- Take care on the bind off to make the loops loose enough that they will not constrict the neck warmer's stretch, or it may be difficult to get it over your head.
- Flat removal method:
 - 1 Knit the first two pegs.
 - 2 Move the loop on the second peg onto the first peg. Knit off.
 - 3 Stretch the loop on the first peg so it increases in size enough that it will easily go on the second peg also, using slack from the working yarn. Remove the loop from the first peg.
 - 4 Knit the next peg.
 - 5 Repeat steps 2 – 4 until there is only one loop left on the loom.
 - 6 Cut the yarn, leaving an 8" tail.

- 7 Refer to illustration below: Thread the yarn onto a tapestry needle and (1) bring up through the live loop. (2) Pass it under the first chain of the bind off, then (3) back down through the live loop. Secure yarn.



Directions:

- Cast on with the e-wrap cast-on method.
- With the twisted stockinette (e-wrap) stitch, knit 28 (36) rows.
- Bring up cast on edge and put loops onto the pegs as for turning a hat brim. Do not knit off.
- Loosely bind off with the flat removal method (see notes), knitting two loops over one.
- Hide tails in between the two layers of knitting.
- Adjust the tube so the bound off seam is in the middle on the inside.
